Step 1:	Apply to Colleges/Tech Schools Online
	Some require application fees, essays, recommendation letters, etc.
Step 2:	Send your transcript/ACT scores to schools you have applied to.
	Link on the GHS website.
Step 3:	If the College requires a letter of recommendation, fill out the
	request form on the GHS website.
Step 4:	Do your FASA with your Parent/Guardian-Opens Oct. 1st.
Step 5:	Apply for Scholarships
	Look at the College's website for Merit Based Scholarships. Some have separate applications for this process and have deadlines as early as
	November 1st. Use the Scholarship Database on GHS Website and Scholarship Search Sites to find additional scholarships.
Step 6:	Retake ACT if you are trying to achieve a certain score for College
	Acceptance or Merit Based Scholarships.
Step 7:	You have been accepted! Now what?
	Turn in acceptance letters to Mrs. Keya Wilson to be announced over the intercom.
	 Financial aid packages will be shared by your College of choice in the Spring.
	Turn in Scholarships awarded to your Counselor.

Step 1: You must complete a profile on the NCAA Clearinghouse and/or NAIA Eligibility Center as soon as possible. Please check eligibility requirements to ensure you qualify. Your senior math class must be higher than Bridge Math and you must meet the core requirements set by NCAA/ NAIA. If you are not on fee waiver, you will have to pay to complete your profile.

Step 2: When you have completed your profile, let Mrs. Harvey in the Counseling Office know so she can upload your transcript and verify your fee waiver, if applicable. You can email her at **brooke.harvey@sumnerschools.org**.

Step 3: Your ACT scores must be sent directly from ACT to NCCA/NAIA. The school cannot send scores for you. To send your scores for free, we advise you to list NCAA and NAIA to receive your scores when we bubble for the Senior ACT retake in October. If you wait to send your scores later, you will have to login to www.act.org and pay to have your

- 2. Click Create a Log In
- 3. Create your account the following is required
 - Username must be 6-25 numbers and letters (no spaces)
 - First name (use first name from Social Security Card)
 - Last name
 - o. SSN (Social Security Number)
 - Date of birth MMDDYYY format
 - o Email (students should use a personal email rather than a school-issued email)
 - Reenter email
 - o Password (e.g. Fall2@21)
 - Cannot contain first name, last name, or username
 - Must be 8 25 characters
 - Must include 1 uppercase letter
 - Must include 1 lowercase letter
 - Must include 1 number
 - Must include 1 character from this list ~!@#\$%^&*_-+=`|\(){}[]:;'"<>,.?/
 - Reenter password (e.g. Fall2@21)
 - Challenge questions select three different questions; answers must be at least four characters
 - Select a personal image
 - Check the box beside "I acknowledge by gaining..." statement
 - Click Create My Account (do not hit enter on keyboard)



 - Enter your high school graduation date MMDDYYY format

How Financial Aid Works Finding Sources of Financial Aid Ventform Students receive all of the infinancial aids

Very few students receive all of their financial aid for college from one source. When you are searching for financial aid, consider a wide variety of options and apply to as many programs as possible. Here are some common types of organizations that offer financial aid:

- The government: The Federal Government offers over \$150 billion in aid each year. Likewise, Tennessee offers millions of dollars to its students. Visit <u>studentaid.ed.gov</u> to learn about federal programs and visit <u>www.tn.gov/CollegePays</u> and <u>www.CollegeforTN.org</u> for Tennessee opportunities.
- Your college: Colleges and universities offer financial aid programs for their students. Visit the financial aid webpages of every college you are considering, and apply for all of the scholarships you think you might be eligible to receive.
- The community: Non-profit organizations, foundations, and businesses often provide scholarships as a community service. To find these programs, talk to your counselor or check out the scholarship finder on www.CollegeforTN.org.

Types of Financial Aid

Grants	Grants are free money — they don't have to be repaid. Grants come from
	the State and Federal Government as well as from colleges. Generally,
	grants are based on financial mond which we are that the common and all

grants are based on financial need, which means that they are awarded based on your family's size and financial circumstances.

Scholarships Scholarships are also free money and don't need to be repaid.

Scholarships can come from a variety of places, from state and federal governments, to colleges, to private companies. Scholarships may be awarded based on your financial need, academic achievement, community service, athletic talent, and many other factors.

Loans Loans are money that you borrow from a ban

Loans are money that you borrow from a bank, government, or private lending company. A loan must be repaid with interest. Loans offered by the government often have lower interest rates and can be repaid over an extended period of time. Visit www.studentloans.gov for more information.

Work study programs

Work study allows you to receive funds through part-time employment while you are enrolled in college and can help you pay part of your college costs. Unlike other campus jobs, students apply for work study by submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
